Dear Parents & Carers,

With a break in the newsletter last week due to Stage 3 enjoying themselves in Canberra there is so much to catch up on.

Australiana Extravaganza

Over a week has passed now since this wonderful event and people are still passing me in the street commenting on what a wonderful event. Regardless of what we do it never ceases to amaze me how incredibly generous people are. This event would not have been the success it was without people coming forward on so many different levels. It reinforced clearly the strong community partnership and as I was walking around I overheard a comment that I think summed it up when they were talking about the event and the large number of people in attendance 'this is just what Wang is'.



Centacare requires part time Home Tutors to assist with delivering the HIPPY program.




Centacare is accepting enrolments for 2014 from families living in the Lithgow, Walle-

Books for the Philippines

Steven Foo, martial artist and Manager at Automation Security in the Philippines, started this project after a group of IT Professionals in Manila spoke out about a Government plan to give computers to schools. Members of the Computer Professionals Union pointed out that most schools in poorer areas of the Philippines don't even have books, let alone computers.

Steve discussed the problem with Australian disabled martial artist Peter Lee, who set up the task of collecting as many books as possible to send to the Philippines.

We are seeking the assistance of your school community in helping to gather books. Other schools in Lithgow have donated their old library books and old readers. It would be great if we could leave a box in your foyer for parents and children to drop in books, both old and new, that will benefit entire generations of Filipino school children.
