# From the Principal's Desk

### 2015 School Swimming and Water Safety Program

Last week Wallerawang Public School and Cooerwull Public School took part in the 2015 School Swimming and Water Safety Program. This program is a very successful and widely recognized initiative coordinated by Western School Sports Association.

This year 60 students from Year 2 through to Year 6 participated in 10 swimming lessons and 9 water safety lessons over 5 days. The program is aimed at non-swimmers and still developing swimmers. Lessons throughout the week build on from water confidence in waist deep water for our nonswimmers to deeper water for more confident swimmers where they learn to tread water, do a survival float and learn the basics of freestyle, backstroke and breaststroke. All students made pleasing personal growth in their swimming abilities throughout the lessons.
















# Sport and Recreation's Swim and Survive lessons
