Donations towards our Farmers card inject immediate cash into the rural towns, city cash going bush. Finally what hay we deliver saves farmers cash that they can continue to spend on other items.

NAPLAN Online School Readiness Test

During Week 5, students in Years 3 and 5 will participate in the NAPLAN Online School Readiness Test. This test is a small, online version of NAPLAN that is designed to test our computer network and systems to see if our school is ready to go to the NAPLAN Online Platform. Year 5 students will sit an online test in writing, as well as an omnibus test which gives a mixture of questions testing maths, reading and spelling. Year 3 students will only sit the omnibus test. No results will be made available to either parents or the school on how students perform as it is only testing the computer and network systems.
